

Measures in Response to COVID-19

From Now Onwards

1. Japanese Government's Guidelines on Mask-Wearing and Basic Policies for Infection Control

Date	Mask-wearing	Basic measures for infection control to follow: (1) Avoiding the "Three Cs"; (2) Maintaining physical distancing between people; (3) Hand sanitization (e.g. washing hands); and (4) Ventilation
Feb 10 - Mar 12	Masks to be worn	Required to take basic measures for infection control (1) to (4)
Mar 13 - Mar 31	Individual judgement ^{*1}	Same as above
Apr 1 - May 7	Individual judgement	Same as above
From May 8	Individual judgement	With the abolition of the "Basic Policies for Novel Coronavirus Disease Control" by the Japanese government, it will be left to universities to make decisions about taking infection control measures

*1 - From March 13, mask-wearing in the society in general (except in schools) is left to the judgment of the individual person.

- Mask-wearing in schools will be left to the judgment of the individual from April 1.
- As a general rule, mask-wearing at graduation ceremonies which take place before April will not be mandatory.

Apr 1 - May 7	Individual judgement	Resume to the number of people in a classroom as it was before the COVID-19 Take basic measures for infection control (3) and (4); and be aware of (1) and (2)	Take basic measures for infection control (3) and (4); and be aware of (1) and (2) in the laboratories	Take measures based on the notification, “Extra-curricular activities from April Onwards”, which will be announced by TUAT in the late March, 2023	Same as above	Same as above
